## Venue

The venue has altered from that originally announced, and is now  
**St Alban's Centre, Baldwins Gardens, London, EC1N 7AB**

The entrance is in Baldwins Gardens, which lies on the east side of Gray's Inn Road, a couple of hundred yards north of Holborn. Walk north up Gray's Inn Road from Chancery Lane tube, and take the first turning on your right (Baldwins Gardens). Walk for about one hundred yards (walking past and ignoring the entrance to the church on your right). The entrance to the St Albans Centre is on your right, opposite a sunken garden, shortly after you have passed a school on your left.
